Conflict within the nursing profession has traditionally generated negative feelings to the extent that many nurses use avoidance as a coping mechanism because of their feeling that the "public's stereotypical image of them demanded that they be 'nice,' self-sacrificing, and submissive nurses and that if they engaged in conflict they would be branded emotional or unfeminine women" (Kelly, 2006, p. 27).
