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### Discharge Instructions For Outpatient Procedures

Provide Clear Discharge Instructions. All instructions for care at home, including medications, diet, therapy, and follow-up appointments, must be explained in detail to all patients and then presented in written form to take home upon discharge. Exact dates and times of follow-up appointments need to be included.

### Discharge Instructions for Patients: Best Practices

Discharge instructions are a form of patient education and patient communication intended to inform the patient and/or caregiver of important information related to the medical care the patient has received.

### Discharge Instructions in the Outpatient Setting: Nursing ...

A hospital will discharge you when you no longer need to receive inpatient care and can go home. Or, a hospital will discharge you to send you to another type of facility. Many hospitals have a discharge planner. This person helps coordinate the information and care you'll need after you leave.

Discharge Instructions for Coronary Angioplasty and Stenting. During your angioplasty, a doctor inserts a thin tube called a catheter into a blood vessel in your groin or wrist. The catheter is guided through your blood vessel to a blocked area in one of your heart's arteries. The doctor inflates a tiny balloon at the tip of the catheter and stretches the blocked vessel so blood can flow freely.

After the surgery, the surgeon briefed the patient in the post-anesthesia care unit (PACU) on his findings and the revised postoperative instructions. Because of the microfracture procedure, she was to be completely non-weight bearing for 6 weeks—a significant change from what had been originally anticipated.

EGD is done with an endoscope. This is a flexible tube with a camera at the end. During the procedure: You received medicine into a vein (IV).; The scope was inserted through the esophagus (food pipe) to the stomach and first part of the small intestine ().Air was put through the endoscope to make it easier for the doctor to see.

### Policies and Procedures for Outpatient Surgery

Nurses must dedicate time for assessments and discharge teaching. Effective patient teaching requires uninterrupted blocks of time. To support this, post signs outside the patient's room to indicate a "do not disturb zone." Patient assignments may be handed off so that the nurse can give the patient his or her undivided attention.

Port Placement Discharge Instructions - 2 - Special Instructions • Wound care: The dressing over your port site may be removed after 3-4 days. After removing the dressing, gently wash area daily with mild soap and water. Pat dry. Cover with sterile dressing or band aid for 7 -10 days or until site is healed.
